Safe-Rx rankings are based on an analysis of data from new e-prescriptions and renewal request responses electronically transmitted over the Surescripts network. States are ranked according to the number of prescriptions routed electronically in 2008 as a percentage of the total number of prescriptions eligible for electronic routing. The total number of eligible prescriptions does not include controlled substances as they are not eligible for e-prescribing under current DEA regulations. The total number of eligible prescriptions also excludes preauthorized refills on existing prescriptions because they do not require communication between a physician and a pharmacist. At the end of 2009, Surescripts will add the use of prescription benefit information and prescription history to the calculation of state Safe-Rx rankings.
